11 am, **Teri Navickas** from Brick Kiln Farm will demonstrate the art of arranging and planting in the Japanese style known as Kokadama, also known as poor man's Bonsai. She will utilize plants and peat, and demonstrate how to set them in hand crafted ceramic vessels.

12:30 am, **John Wilson**, owner and head chef at Water Street Kitchen and Seth Rainville, a New England potter, educator, currently teaching at the Falmouth Art Center, and curator, will discuss food, and how the vessels we plate on elevate the experience of eating. Chef Wilson will treat participants to a live cooking demo during the discussion.

2:00 pm, **Holly Hudson**, an interior decorator, will be discussing living with art. Topics will include how to stage and arrange your home and how to combine your sense of style with the art you collect.
